PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 1st November 2019

Thursday morning my wife and I were walking our dog near the golf course at Bargara, when some very annoyed plovers came swooping in. Looking around, their two tiny chicks were crossing the road. Alerted by the calls of their parents, the tiny chicks immediately crouched low to the road and stayed perfectly still. All well and good, except that the passing cars were unaware of the chicks on the road and would soon skittle them. So with the dog going a little crazy, and the adult plovers in more of a frenzy, we picked up the chicks and moved them across the road – safe at least for a time.

It made for an interesting walk, and I know not everyone is a fan, but I just love plovers. The way they look out for their young is amazing. During incubation, the parents take turns sitting on the nest so that the eggs are protected 24 hours a day. The absolute selfless way a bird of about 50g takes on anything or anyone who threatens their young is just so impressive to me. Any parent who sees something like this, just gets it. Like the plovers, our young are the most important thing in the world to us.

On Monday, we will welcome 75 new Preps to our school. It will be a morning of mixed emotions – for both the children and their parents – some fear and some excitement. Parents will feel it more. They will have a sense of having to relinquish the most precious person in their life, over to us here at our school. We can all remember those times when we've had to entrust care of our children onto someone else - and it's not easy.

The beauty of our community, is that parents can trust us. There are adults here dedicated to keeping our students safe – caring for them physically, spiritually and emotionally. It is an enormous responsibility. It is also an amazing honour and we feel very privileged that so many beautiful families have chosen us to care for their child at school.

I also have to commend our students here. On Monday I watched as a little Prep raced from the eating area towards the classroom. She faceplanted with some speed onto the grass. Without any prompting or direction, another Prep girl from her table went straight over, gave her a hand to get back on her feet, and accompanied her back all before the teachers or I could get to her. We will always have some issues, but there are stacks of caring kids in our school, choosing to be kind every day. We look forward to more of them joining us Monday.

## **Senior School Swimming Carnival (Years 3-6)**

## Thursday, 28th November

#### **Bundaberg Swim Academy, Fitzgerald Street**

The format for the carnival will be as follows:

Years 3 & 4: 9:00am - 11:00am Years 5 & 6: 11:00am - 12:30pm

Presentations: 2:30 pm at School (Overall Points and Age Championships for students born 2007-2009).

All students are encouraged to nominate for a A/B/C division race in freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke events. <u>Students must nominate in at least one event in the program.</u> Novelty events will be included in the program. The carnival will involve all students and the aim is to make the day enjoyable for all students with an emphasis on maximum participation.

<u>'A' DIVISION RACES Students born 2007-2010 (Age Champion Event)</u> – 50m event in freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. Students nominating for 50m events need to be able to enter deep water either diving from the blocks or the side and swim correctly and confidently the entire 50m. Only students born 2010, 2009, 2008 and 2007 are eligible to nominate for this distance.

<u>'B' DIVISION RACES Students born 2007-2011</u> – 25m event in freestyle, backstroke and breast stroke. Students nominating for 25m events will be starting in the pool and swim correctly and confidently the entire 25m.

<u>'C' DIVISION RACES Students born 2007-2011</u> – 12m event in freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. Students nominating for 12m events will be starting in the pool and swim with or without the assistance of a kickboard to a half-way rope.

Children will travel by bus to the Bundaberg Swim Academy with their class teacher who will supervise students in travel and throughout the carnival. Students may wear their school sports uniform and House coloured shirt to school on this day. Year 3 & 4 students are asked to wear their swimming togs under their uniform upon arrival to school. Year 5 & 6 students will change into their swimming gear, sun-shirt and thongs/sandals prior to leaving the school grounds. Underwear, uniform, shoes and socks will remain at school and children will change into their uniforms upon returning to school after the carnival. Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly named.

All students are required to wear a sun-shirt as this meets with sun-safety regulations. The school will provide sunscreen for students. The only items that students will take with them to the pool are goggles, towel/s, water bottle and a bag to carry their belongings. Lunch and afternoon tea will be at normal times at school with the Year 5 & 6 students eating before leaving the school.

#### **HOW TO NOMINATE YOUR CHILD**

Please login to <u>Parent Lounge</u> to indicate your child's race preferences by Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> November. Please choose only one option for Freestyle, Breaststroke and Backstroke. Students must nominate in at least <u>one event in the program</u>. If your child suffers from any medical conditions which may affect your child's participation in the carnival, please advise the office of these details. All students are expected to participate unless there is a health matter that prevents their involvement on the day.
