

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

15 August 2025

This week, Courtyard Prayer was led for the final time by 6H. Aria W. shared a reading from John 14:27: "**Peace I leave you**; **my peace I give you**." This reading, and the message in Year Six's prayer, reminded me that when translated, Jesus' chosen words would have included **shalom**—the Hebrew word often translated as "peace," but carrying a much richer meaning.

Shalom encompasses:

- **Peace** both an inner calm and harmony in relationships.
- Wholeness being complete and unbroken.
- Well-being physical, emotional, and spiritual flourishing.
- **Harmony** balance within a community or the wider world.

When we connect *shalom* to student belonging and connectedness, it can symbolise:

- A safe and welcoming environment where students feel valued.
- Mutual respect and trust between students, staff, and families.
- Unity in diversity, where differences are embraced as part of the whole.

A shared sense of purpose and care, creating a community where everyone can thrive.

In this sense, *shalom* isn't just the absence of conflict—it's the presence of deep relationships that are not always perfect, but restorative in nature. These are at the heart of fostering belonging in a school community.

When I worked at Shalom College, people would often ask why a Catholic college would be given such a name. Reflecting on the deeper meaning of *shalom*, it suddenly seems perfect—capturing the very essence of what any Catholic community aspires to enhance. Creating this sense of connectedness and belonging is not always easy. It takes time, intention, and constant reflection on whether we are truly hitting the mark. But I believe this vision—the hope for each member of our community—is what gets us up in the morning.

At this week's Board meeting, Mr Ben Pollock was scheduled to share the opening reflection. Often, we share a text, research, wondering, piece of scripture or something that has inspired us. This time, Ben wrote his own heartfelt reflection, which he has generously given permission to share in this newsletter.

Ben spoke of his youngest child soon graduating from St. Patrick's and how it is the end of an era for his family. He acknowledged the challenges that face society today, celebrated our collective wins, and encouraged us to look ahead with optimism in preparing our young people—not just for the next stage of school, but for life. His words resonated deep within me, as it brought to mind the familiar Catholic Education catchery "Together we can make a difference". I would encourage you to take the time to read Ben's reflection. I have also provided a copy for staff to read. It saddens me to hear of teachers leaving the wonderful profession of education, due to not feeling respected or appreciated. Ben's acknowledgement of a 'collective commitment as being the foundation for everything we achieve' recognises those in our community willing to go the extra mile to offer a 'holistic' education. How blessed we are to receive words of celebration and appreciation. The media would have us believe this doesn't occur everywhere.


As Pope Francis reminded us:

From mid-December, Australian children under 16 will not be allowed to hold accounts on certain social media platforms. The age restrictions are likely to apply to Instagram, Facebook, Snapchat, TikTok and YouTube, among other platforms. Online gaming and standalone messaging apps are among a number of types of services that have been excluded.

This week is **Bullying No Way: National Week of Action** (11-15 August). Parents and carers have an important role to play in preventing and addressing bullying online, here are 7 ways to support them.

- 1. Reassure them that you're here for them and that you won't take away their devices.
- 2. Listen without judgement when they open up.
- 3. Collect evidence of the bullying, like screenshots and URLs.
- 4. **Help them report it** to the platform or social media site. Read <u>The eSafety Guide</u> for advice on how to do this on specific platforms.
- 5. No response? Report it to eSafety.gov.au/report.
- 6. Update their privacy settings across devices and accounts.
- 7. Encourage and help them to reach out for support.

Smartwatch Policy

Smart watches are not permitted at St Patrick's. They are not only expensive but difficult to control as they present privacy issues to the school. Smart watches are considered to be watches with any of the following fea-

- Wi-Fi or 3G/4G connectivity
- Inbuilt camera
- Ability to display photos
- Capable of sending or receiving text messages, calls or notifications from another device

Parents who believe their child has a specific reason for the use of such a device (e.g. medical) are required to make appointment to meet with the Principal to discuss further.
