The Moso Bamboo plant grows in China. After a Moso is planted, no visible growth occurs for up to five years—even under ideal conditions! Then, as if by magic, it suddenly begins growing at the height of nearly two- and one-half feet per day, reaching full height of ninety feet within six weeks. But it's not magic. The Moso's rapid growth is due to the miles of roots it develops during those first five years, five years of getting ready.

I have shared this text, written by Joel Weldon and this following story before, it is a gem which I have kept close as I've navigated my way through not only my career but parenthood. It strongly parallels the teaching and learning process for many as growth and development in young people can sometimes be difficult to measure. The Moso reminds me especially of one young man's journey through the education process. I taught this delightful human in his 3rd and 4th year of schooling. When I first assessed this student in his formative years, he had very little alphabet and next to no phonological awareness. This made the reading process seem impossible for him to grasp. Despite his challenges, he hung on every word and never lost his enthusiasm for learning. He was a pleasure to teach. However, I was often frustrated that despite the intervention poured in from home and school, the progress could not be measured and seemed slight. Years later, I noticed his name appearing alongside 'English' on his High School Awards list. This really caught my attention and made me immensely proud, but also curious. Years later we caught up. He had recently graduated from university as an engineer, so I acknowledged how he must have experienced great success by the end of his school years. His response, 'I could have done better Miss'. Looking perplexed he smiled and in jest said 'I only got an OP 2— should have got an OP 1'. You see it was his work ethic that had developed at a faster rate than his initial success, which proved his biggest asset once all the growth began to occur. Report cards will be released next week, so I thought the Moso Bamboo tree and this young man's story, timely. Report cards are wonderful pieces of information to be shared between Teacher and Parent, but don't always indicate the growth occurring below the surface. For some the progress will be substantial, but for others, the growth is yet to come or is occurring in other facets of life. It is also important to remember that a 'C' level of achievement (for example) should never be underestimated, as it means something very different to when we attended school.

Yesterday, our Senior and Junior Strings students attended a Music Retreat out at Chaverim. This was a wonderful opportunity for students to sharpen their skills. At the culmination of the day we joined parents to sample a taste of talent via a short concert. We are very appreciative of our tutors Kate Hardisty and Bernadette Connolly who first sprinkle seeds to all Year 3 students and then continue to afford their time and expertise to students choosing to continue their musical journey. A big thank you also to Mrs. Cook and Mrs. Botha who accompanied the students throughout the day. We wish these students well as they continue to prepare for the eisteddfod next term.

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS - 2025

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2013, 2014 & 2015 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a **Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form**.


